

ARABIC - BEGINNING, MICROCREDENTIAL (MADRID) (BEGINNING FALL 2025)

The Microcredential in Beginning Arabic is an academic micro-credential consisting of 6 required credit hours offered on the Madrid campus only. Satisfactory completion of the required courses allows the student to develop the necessary skills to conduct beginning-level communication in Arabic through the acquisition of appropriate vocabulary, grammar, reading, writing, listening comprehension, speaking capabilities, and an introduction to Arabic-speaking culture.

The Microcredential in Beginning Arabic aligns itself with similar programs both on the Madrid Campus, and in the Department of Languages, Literatures, and Cultures in St. Louis, in that it is designed to help students gain a broader understanding of themselves, as well as the languages and cultures of others.
