# FRENCH - ADVANCED, MICROCREDENTIAL

The Microcredential in Advanced French consists of six required credit hours. Satisfactory completion of the required courses would allow the student to develop the necessary skills to conduct proficient-level communication in French through the acquisition of appropriate vocabulary, grammar, reading, writing, listening comprehension, speaking capabilities and an exploration of issues in French-speaking culture.

The Microcredential in Advanced French aligns itself with all other programs in the Department of Languages, Literatures and Cultures in that it is designed to help students gain a broader understanding of themselves, as well as the languages and cultures of others. This inherently fosters an understanding and appreciation for diverse perspectives and represents a crucial virtue in today's globalized world.

#### **Continuation Standards**

Students are expected to earn a grade of "C" or better in each required course. Students who do not achieve the "C" or better grade in a required course will be expected to repeat the course in an attempt to achieve the "C" or better grade. Students may repeat a required course one time. Failure to achieve the "C" or better grade after one repeat attempt will have the student dismissed from the microcredential in Advanced French.

### Madrid

Of the two required courses, only FREN 2010 is regularly offered in Madrid. 3xxx-level courses are offered in St. Louis. Students can only partially complete the Microcredential in Advanced French in Madrid; students may complete it at the St. Louis campus partially or entirely.
