

GERMAN - INTERMEDIATE, MICROCREDENTIAL

Saint Louis University's Microcredential in Intermediate German consists of six required credit hours. Satisfactory completion of the required courses would allow the student to develop the necessary skills to conduct intermediate-level communication in German through the acquisition of appropriate vocabulary, grammar, reading, writing, listening comprehension, speaking capabilities, and an introduction to German-speaking culture.

The Microcredential in Intermediate German aligns itself with all other programs in SLU's Department of Languages, Literatures, and Cultures in that it is designed to help students gain a broader understanding of themselves, as well as the languages and cultures of others. This inherently fosters an understanding and appreciation for diverse perspectives and represents a crucial virtue in today's globalized world.
