

PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT, M.M.S. & PUBLIC HEALTH, M.P.H. DUAL DEGREE

Saint Louis University's Master of Public Health and Physician Assistant Master of Medical Science dual-degree program is a collaboration between the College for Public Health and Social Justice (<https://www.slu.edu/public-health-social-justice/>) and the Doisy College of Health Sciences Department of Clinical Health Sciences (<https://catalog.slu.edu/colleges-schools/health-sciences/clinical-health-sciences/>).

Pursuing the two degrees together as a dual degree allows students to complete both degrees in an accelerated fashion as compared to completing them separately or sequentially. Students in the dual degree focus first on the M.P.H., taking three consecutive semesters (summer, fall, spring) devoted entirely to M.P.H. coursework. Then, students shift their focus to their M.M.S. studies within the Doisy College of Health Sciences. Nine credit hours of coursework in the M.M.S. curriculum also count as elective credits towards completion of the M.P.H. degree, providing the credit efficiency that allows students to complete both degrees in 3.5 academic years. Students interested in earning the MPH/MMS dual degree apply separately to both programs prior to starting either one.

Saint Louis University's College for Public Health and Social Justice is fully accredited by the Council on Education for Public Health (CEPH). The Physician Assistant Program is fully accredited by the Accreditation Review Commission on Education for the Physician Assistant, Inc. (ARC-PA).

Students must meet the admission requirements and be admitted into both degree programs according to the processes of each of the participating academic units in order to pursue a dual degree program.

Individuals may apply to the M.P.H. degree program concurrently with application to or following their admission to the Doisy College of Health Sciences; however, admission to the dual degree program is contingent upon admission to both the M.P.H. and the M.M.S. degree programs.

Program Notes: Extended Spring semesters run from early January through late June and extended Fall semesters run from late June through December. Also, the nine credit hours of coursework taken from the MMS courses PAED 5010, PAED 5070, PAED 5300 and PAED 6000 (x2) also count as elective credits towards the student's MPH degree.

The final semester of dedicated MPH coursework may extend into the summer months prior to the beginning of the MMS coursework as students complete the Practice Experience in Public Health (PUBH 5910).
