

# CRIMINOLOGY AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE, B.A. TO M.A. ACCELERATED PROGRAM

Students pursuing a Bachelor of Arts in Criminology and Criminal Justice at Saint Louis University who are interested in pursuing a Master of Arts in Criminology and Criminal Justice have the opportunity to begin graduate coursework toward the M.A. in the senior year of their undergraduate studies. Students select a concentration in the master's program in the spring semester of their junior year in one of three areas: administration of justice, emergency management, or treatment and rehabilitation.

## Admission

Students who have a minimum overall GPA of 3.00, and "Bs" or better in their criminology and criminal justice courses, are eligible to apply to the accelerated master's program in the spring semester of their junior year.

Upon provisional and conditional acceptance to the M.A. program, students select a concentration in one of three areas: administration of justice, emergency management or treatment and rehabilitation.

## Requirements

After graduating with a B.A. in criminology and criminal justice and meeting the admissions requirements of the M.A. in criminology and criminal justice, students can begin the master's program during the summer or fall following their May graduation. Students considering this option need to carefully plan their schedules with their academic advisor and M.A. program director.

Undergraduate students may take up to 12 credits of the following graduate courses in their senior year.
